Frequently asked questions

How long does the performance last? - Two 50 minute sets with a 15 minute interval in between.

What would be the target audience? – Though Christians will find this a stimulating and uplifting evening, we are looking at this as an outreach resource, so... people on the fringes. Usually these are people who have connections with church through, say, coffee mornings, Alpha, various groups etc. We would also suggest personal invites to people who have dropped out of Church. Musical and artistic types would find this interesting.

Can you give us some idea of the repertoire? – In addition to Dave singing many of his own compositions (some written specifically for the evening), Dave draws from many of the mainstream songs that have influenced his musical journey including Fats Waller, Paul Simon and The Beatles, particularly in the first half. Not only does this give a greater insight into Dave and his own music but also helps non-churched people engage and relate to Dave's heart and message.

What sort of setting or venue is best? - Some promoters have chosen intimate spaces: small theatres, Arts Centres or Starbucks (private hire) etc. Many are holding in the church which can work with lights and blackout. Blackout is important due to the multi-media element of the evening. For some, tables with candles are worth consideration if we are in a church venue.

Is it directly evangelistic or more bridge building? - Bridge building. Tales of a Troubadour describes Dave's journey of faith along with musical influences. The 1st half is focussed on his home town (London), growing up, music and finding God. The 2nd half has an international flavour describing adventures and struggles of his life as a troubadour. The aim is to help people evaluate their own life in relation to purpose and ultimately God's grace and presence.

Will it involve Praise & Worship? - No; it will be more of a listening type evening. Dave will be available to do specific Praise and Worship events on other occasions outside of the "Tales of a Troubadour" setting.
